BULLETIN DISTRIBUTION PROBLEMS

Does your Society order additional copies of the *Bulletin*? If so, does the parcel arrive in good condition?

From time to time Societies have reported damage to their parcels, although usually the damage is confined to the packaging and the copies have been intact. Most recently there were several instances of this with the Autumn 2007 issue, and in one or two cases the packaging was so badly damaged that the Royal Mail had enclosed the parcel in a plastic bag. The problem was largely confined to the larger consignments.

As the parcels are despatched directly from the printers I have taken up the matter with them. They have agreed that the envelopes used were too flimsy and that they will use better quality packaging for future issues, so hopefully the problem has been solved.
